## **Project Description**

Phase One funds would help increase CAF's currently limited operational capacity to implement and replicate "Solar4Us", an innovative, replicable community solar project model that (1) reduces the energy burden of disadvantaged communities, and (2) elevates disadvantaged communities into the clean energy economy by building local capacity. Solar4Us projects aim to:

- 1 Meaningfully reduce the **energy burden** and carbon footprint of low- to moderate-income ("LMI") and disadvantaged households by allocating them 100% discounted solar energy;
- 2 Be strategically located in **urban**, **infill sites** within disadvantaged communities to facilitate physical and social connectivity between disadvantaged communities and solar projects;
- 3 Offer paid apprenticeships (solar construction + solar project operations) to LMI and disadvantaged residents, laying the groundwork for a **solar-ready workforce**;
- 4 Provide a vehicle for LMI and disadvantaged households' **participation in solar project ownership**, facilitating wealth-creation and capital retention in disadvantaged communities;
- 5 | Rely on local contractors, subcontractors, & employees to strengthen the **local clean energy** economy;
- 6 Partner with local schools and other community-based organizations to advance solar, energy efficiency, and a local clean energy economy;
- 7 | Create a vehicle for participating LMI and disadvantaged households to build credit via solar bills, and thereby access mainstream banking resources; and
- 8 Provide **critical data** and other information to be shared with other institutions and organizations to facilitate the development of similar projects across the country.

## **Targeted Disadvantaged Communities:**

- Low income, high and/or persistent poverty
- Higher unemployment and underemployment
- Racial and ethnic residential segregation
- Substandard housing
- Distressed neighborhoods
- Disproportionate environmental impacts from climate change
- Higher energy cost burden and low energy access
