Our Team of engineers, farmers, and ranchers are working to restore sustainable agriculture and the community of Tucumcari, New Mexico. Our plan is to Integrate the energy reconfiguration of an idled ethanol plant to an advanced anaerobic digester to sustainably supply local energy needs and income for a small rural community from a nearby biomass supply of cattle manure and cheese whey, wind, solar, sewage effluent water, and ground water. The estimated impact of the system if implemented to its full extent could enable agriculture to restore carbon content, culture, and productivity of soils, capture greenhouse gas emissions, efficiently use water, and provide a sustainable energy income model to small communities worldwide.
