This project will be implemented by a partnership between FattE-Bikes, The Boys & Girls Club of the San Luis Valley, and the Alamosa Bicycle Coalition. Project partners will develop a pilot electric bike library program for the underserved communities within the City of Alamosa. The goal of the program will be to create net zero emission electric bike transportation 'libraries' for this rural community. The project will have four key objectives: 1) increase clean energy transportation options within Alamosa; 2) decrease or offset greenhouse emissions from fossil fuel transportation options; 3) facilitate less community dependence on cars within the town and

grow micro mobility usage to replace car trips within the area; 4) increase access to reliable transportation options for community members who traditionally face barriers to secure transportation, including people from marginalized populations such as the corrections involved person entering the workforce, senior citizens, teenage youth, college students attending the local college, and low income residents. Implementation of the pilot project in Alamosa will document best practices and lessons learned so the pilot can be scaled within the town and to other rural communities in Colorado and beyond. Phase 1 funds will be used to develop the ebike library and membership program, strengthen local partnerships that will assist in Phase 2 implementation, and training and research and development of library infrastructure needs including appropriate ebike models, rental design, maintenance, and storage.
