The team's project for the Buildings Up grant prize is to upgrade the energy efficiency of the Tebughna Foundation's buildings in Tyonek and Anchorage. The Tribal Center and Guest House in Tyonek need significant upgrades, while the Kaloa Building in Anchorage would benefit from energy-saving improvements. Through the upgrade of the Kaloa Building the Tebughna Foundation will also be able to further develop its Tradeworks program and work with local organizations to help provide support for Alaska's at-risk Youth.

The team's upgrade project uses traditional principles of land stewardship for Alaska Native communities to create and identify technical assistance resources for renewable energy technologies.

The Tebughna Foundation team is excited to be awarded the Buildings Up grant prize and looks forward to making their buildings more energy efficient and sustainable.
