Project Overview

- Two community solar projects in the short term (1.05 MW_{DC} total) with a goal to develop 15+ MW_{DC} over the next 6 years.
- Innovative partnership with the City leverages long-term relationship to co-solarize large municipal roofs with 50% serving the building + 50% as community solar.
- No- to low-cost roof lease to drive down energy costs for LMI households.
- One project is located in a Justice40 census tract. Both projects are located in a Persistent Poverty County.
- "Small", on-building installations in partnership with the City is a strategy to unlock current interconnection challenges with IOU.



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Meaningful Benefits

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- Four meaningful benefit goals for each project.
- 1: 40%+ reduction in energy costs for LMI subscribers. Will leverage nonprofit status and low-cost roof leases to achieve this goal.
- 2: Prioritize residents of Piedmont Housing Alliance properties (most are below 40% Area Median Income).
 - 3: LMI subscribers will have equity and decisionmaking power in developments. Exact structure to be determined.
- 4: As with our housing development work, we are committed to prevailing wage levels and mandating local hiring requirements for contractors.
